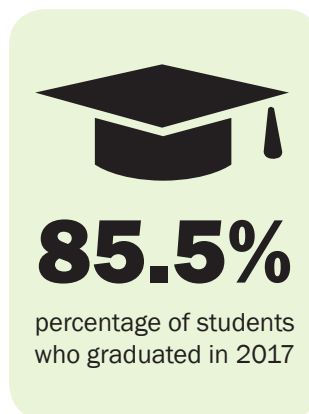
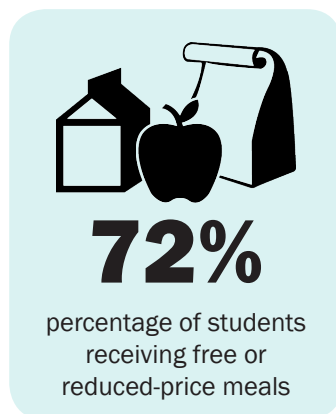
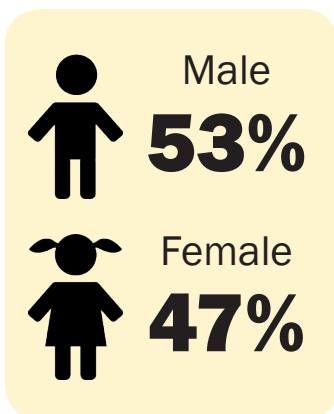
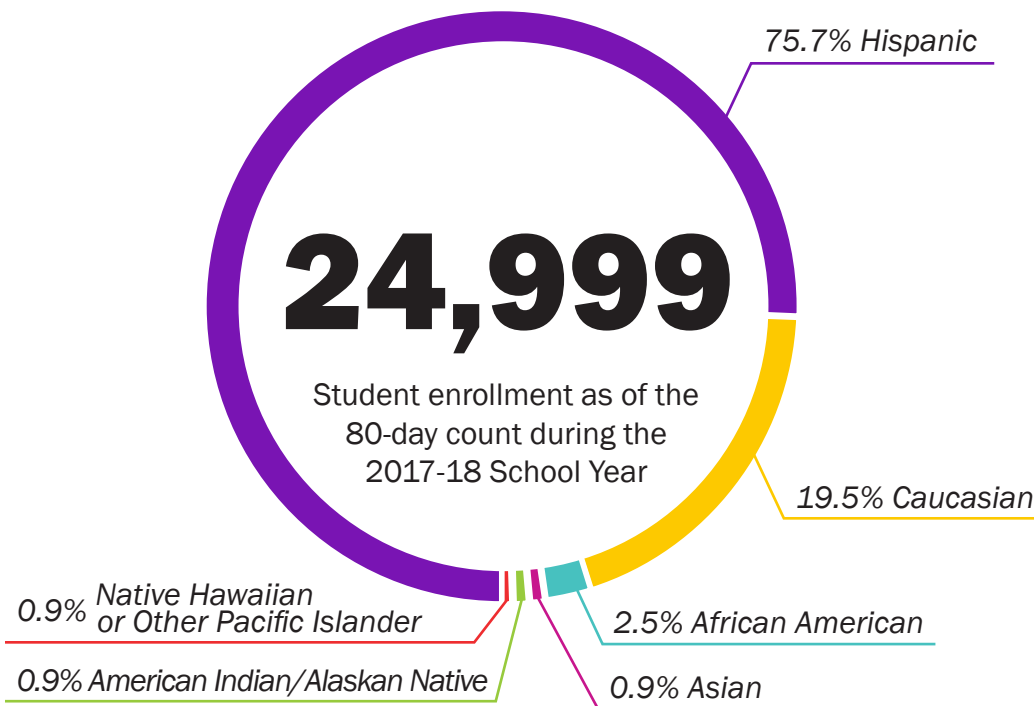


## Community

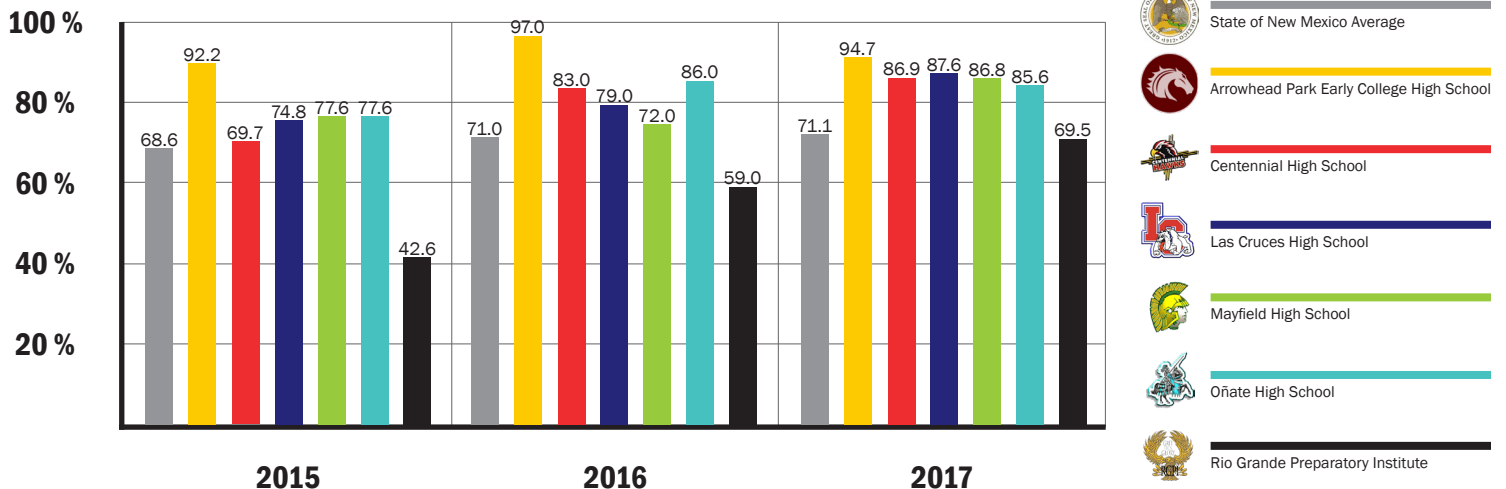

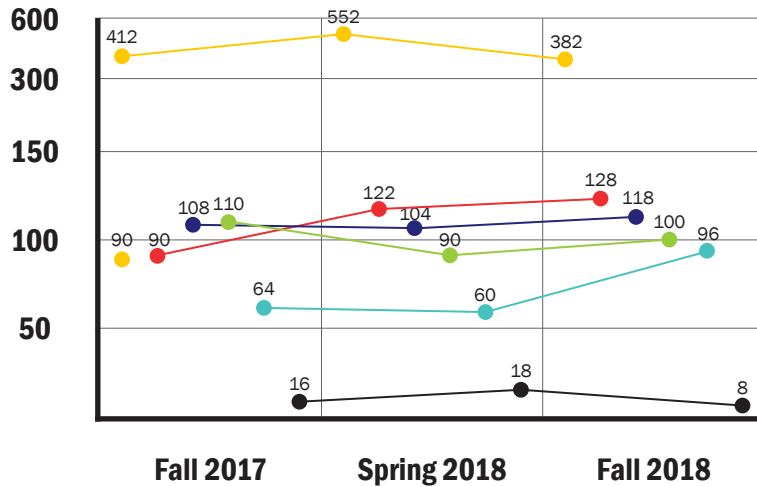
Number of AP students per grade level who scored 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam during the 2017/18 year divided by the total number of students in each grade.

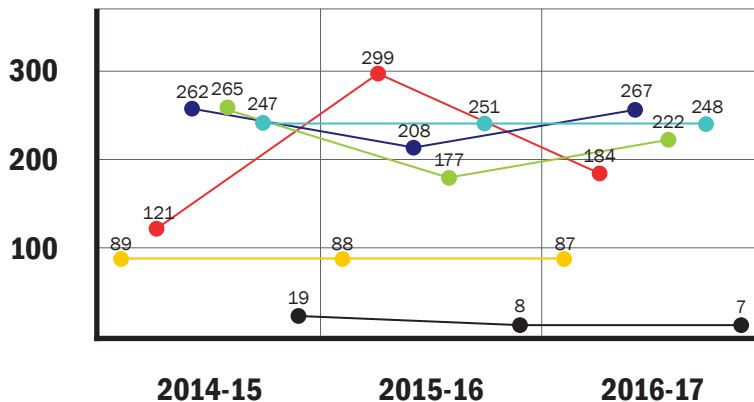

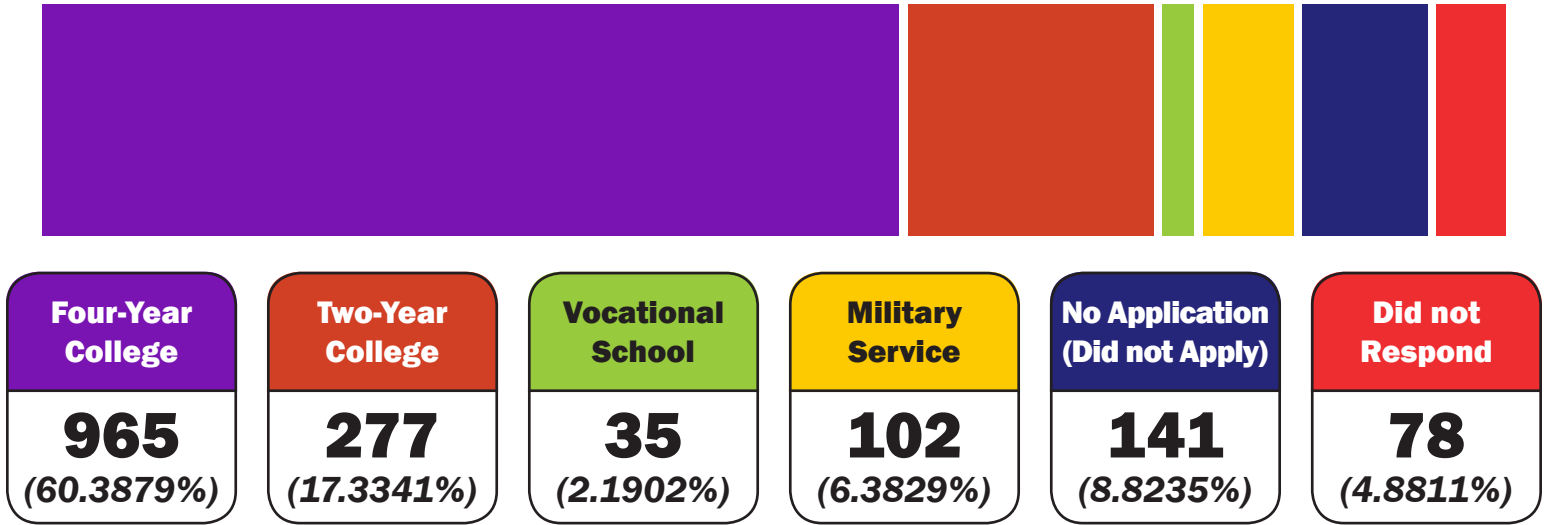
**Number of Students taking ACT Exams**





